

#### Why Pasifika youth?

- 12% of Pacific workers earn more than \$50,000 per annum
- 66.2% of Pacific peoples are employed in either semi-skilled or low-skilled occupations compared to 47% for non-Pacific peoples
- Why?
  - Younger age distribution
  - On average, lower levels of qualification.

- Event Timing
   Scheduling of future events needs to be aligned with tertiary calendars rather than business agendae
- Marketing
   To students: formal and specific undertakings
   from Tertiaries to market the event to students is

required.
